MEDICAL UPDATE

Keeping our kids safe and being ready with first aid has always been an important part of Pathfinding. Each club is expected to have an up-to-date first aid kit, and be able to handle their minor first aid emergencies. However, if the club director feels uncomfortable, or there is a situation beyond basic first aid skills, there will be a medical team available 24/7 from Wednesday, Sept. 26, 8:00 am through Sunday, Sept. 30 at 10:00 am. This team will be staffed by a nurse/firefighter/EMT, or Paramedic and will provide first aid and triage from carts. There will be NO clinic area to report to - all situations should be referred to the medical team by radio - they will respond to you and will be identified by red "medical" vests.

We will have physician available onsite as an alternative to many situations requiring an Urgent Care Clinic (for example, an ear infection needing a prescription).

Each club needs a medical form for EVERY Pathfinder - please make sure the consent forms and the first aid kit are in a convenient, known place in your campground!

MEDICAL/FIRST AID

Every Pathfinder Club should be responsible for basic first aid, and have a first aid kit available in the campsite (First Aid Camping Kit Recommendation posted on this web site). Any injury/illness unable to be managed by the individual club should contact Medical by radio. A Medical Field Team will respond to the situation – teams will be staffed by EMT, Paramedic, RN and/or MD. In addition to radio, Medical Teams will be circulating throughout the camporee on carts. Osceola Cabin is reserved for patients needing continued care as determined by the Medical Team, and will not be open as a walk in clinic. Ambulance and rescue support are within minutes of the camp.
